

Climate adaptation tips for individuals

 Keep your garden green not grey by not installing astroturf or paving your garden but opting for natural grass lawns instead and installing rain gardens and rain planters. This will help tackle the effects of climate change, increase biodiversity, decrease air pollution and help reduce flooding.



 Catch and store rainwater in the winter and drier periods to use for watering gardens in the summer. This can be done with water butts and rainwater planters.
